Presidents Report Ben Munro

To all of you who have reached out to me and to each other, simply to check in or to ask questions or to offer ideas, help, encouragement or even criticism, I thank you. All of it shows your care for the Club. What I have witnessed is your capacity to keep turning up for each other. Not because it is easy. But because it is right. Because you are Vikings!

Whilst we were forced to close our doors for three months in March, 2020 this season should still be remembered by all for the feats that we achieved, the milestones we reached and the special moments that connected our volunteers as members of the Viking tribe. As a Club we are pleased to have once again delivered on our core mission of providing excellence in Surf Life Saving services to Currumbin Beach through our surf lifesaving patrols and our member training and education programs. In 2019/2020, 321 of our active volunteers delivered over 7000 volunteer hours on the beach to ensure 41,641 beach patrons visiting Currumbin Beach were provided with a safe aquatic environment. Our Active members gained 237 new lifesaving awards over the course of the season to ensure that the depth of our lifesaving patrols were well resourced against the award requirements under our patrol service agreement and provide sustainable, skilled and well resourced patrol groups into future seasons.

Whilst we didn't get the opportunity to celebrate our 100th Gala Ball we did have the opportunity to come together for a number of centenary year functions throughout the season to help celebrate our 100th season and allow our members both past and present to reminisce on their special moments as Vikings over 100 years. It was fantastic to see a mix of Vikings past and present at our 100th Years of Memories Lifesavers Lunch and other supporting events across the season. Additionally, we were also extremely fortunate to have a Surf Girl representative this season who dedicated her season to training our members, raising vital funds for the Surf Lifesaving Club and promoting Surf Lifesaving education and awareness amongst the Club members and general community over the season. Thank you to our 100th sub committee, our 2020 Surf Girl and all of our members who supported and attended these programs and events.

To our official Club sponsors, thank you for your ongoing commitment to the Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club. Your support we simply couldn't do without. To our members, I really do hope that you take the opportunity where it arises to help support our sponsors in return and show our appreciation for the support they provide our club and its members. The Club was fortunate to receive a number of grants this season to assist with purchasing equipment, upgrading facilities and delivering our lifesaving programs. A big thank you to Sunland Group, Gold Coast City Council, Karen Andrews MP, the DCS fund and the BSEF fund for your support.

Finally I thank our Surf Life Saving Club Council, Supporters Association Management Committee, our standing committees, sub committees and our dedicated and talented staffing group for your commitment and dedication to making this Club the greatest that it can be. Thank you for making this Club so special and I hope that you continue to do so and help us reach even greater heights in the future.

Training & Education Courtney Taylor



In season 2019/2020 our training and education section focus was primarily on ensuring that our patrolling members and seventeen core patrol groups held the necessary skillset for adherence to our annual Surf Life Saving Queensland Patrol Service Agreement.

A key priority identified by our Training & Education standing committee this season was on ensuring that the Club provides relevant training opportunities to our members, not only benefiting the Club as a whole but also facilitating the opportunity for our Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club members to obtain nationally recognised competencies which can be used externally to surf lifesaving in members professional careers and personal knowledge bases through the introduction of the annual course training calendar.

One of the key focuses of our annual training calendar was the standardisation of emergency care awards to assist with award strengths on patrol. The Club continued with its integration of First Aid and CPR courses as a component of the club based Bronze Medallion/Certificate 2 in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) training syllabus. Again showing the benefits of this integration we were able to process and award a further fifty two new First Aid officers this season to strengthen our patrol roster and add new award members to our members award database.

In season 2018/19 the Club set a new benchmark in training and education and achieved its largest ever increase in awards gained making it a hard one to follow. Despite a premature end to the season due to the Covid-19 pandemic the Club trained a further forty five new Bronze Medallion Holders and thirty one new Surf Rescue Certificate holders this season. It is a tribute to our talented team of Trainers that we are again able to train such a large number of major award holders and provide a pathway for a large number of our active juniors and youth members who are coming through our system and gaining these awards.

We experienced a decrease in the total number of Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management awards gained. Whilst it is pleasing to see members come forward into leadership positions as Patrol Captains this area will be a key focus in the upcoming seasons as part of our strategic plan to ensure that we are identifying future leaders and continue to offer them training courses to ensure they obtain the relevant awards required to hold key positions and have access to a pathway to become a future Patrol Captain and beach leader. Congratulations to all of our members gaining new awards this season and a big welcome to our new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate holders

Finally, thank you to our team of Club trainers, assessors and content experts who make up our education team. The achievements in the training and education section of the Club wouldn't be possible without your dedication and commitment. With the Clubs ever increasing training and educational needs, identifying future trainers and assessors to assist the Club will remain a key focus of future Club strategy.



Vikings storm the waters

THE Currumbin Vikings have taken out their sixth consecutive Australian open pool res-cue title on the Gold Coast.

Twenty-six Australian lifesaving records were broken yesterday alone, with 10 of those records by the Vikings.

Both 2I-year-old Prue Da-vies and 14-year-old Lily Nicholson from Currumbin

won seven gold medals across the weekend, with Nicholson hreaking three Australian life-saving records yesterday. Currumbin teammate Matt Davis won six gold medals

across the 600-person cham-pionships and broke two Aus-

tralian records yesterday.

The Vikings impressed all weekend and notched 485

points, nearly 100 ahead of Northcliffe (387 points).

Maroochydore were third with 340 points.

In the masters championships, Tweed Heads & Coolangaita took out the top spot, winning multiple gold medals and breaking several Austra-lian records for a total of 245

Tweed Heads & Coolangatta's Lisa Ferguson set the only world lifesaving record of the day in the women's 35-39 year-old 100m Manikin Carry with Fins in 59.84 seconds.

Terrigal came in second with 181 points, while Kurrawa finished third with 135 points. Across the championships

After sharing the top spot in 2018, Queensland sneaked ahead of NSW to win the interstate championship with a total of 536 points.

NSW came in second with 489 points and Western Australia third on 462 points.

A major focus of the Supporters Association this financial year was the completion of our first stage of Club renovations. This stage of renovations included an upgrade to the Clubs roof and ceiling, an upgrade of the lighting, sound system, décor and carpet as well as the incorporation of an enclosed eastern balcony to provide for an all weather dining option in this section of the Club.

It was with great fortune that the Government introduced a rescue package in the form of the Job Keeper payment. This rescue package was promptly adopted and endorsed by the Management Committee giving much needed relief to many.

In the proceeding months I am proud to say that our staff have remained in constant contact with each other and in continued contact with the Club, steeling our reserve and further strengthening the bond that we already share as a staffing group and of course members of a community organisation. Our staff are currently working on preparing the venue for reopening and their time and effort to achieve this should be commended.

With the recent changes and imposed regulations the Supporters Association is working tirelessly behind the scenes to create a business model that can deliver ongoing profits to the Surf Life Saving Club whilst operating effectively and efficiently within the restrictive constraints of the Covid -19 pandemic. Rest assured the safety and wellbeing of our staff and patrons is of the highest priority.

Special mention should be given to our CEO, Michael Sullivan and the Supporters Association Management Committee who have again continued to guide the Club in a positive direction. Their support has been unwavering through both the good and the not so good times more recently. This level of support is very much appreciated by myself and this sediment is shared throughout the management and staffing teams. Our members are undoubtedly the foundation of this Club and we as a team will strive to make Currumbin Beach Vikings attractive to existing members and new members alike.

Once again, I would like to thank the Club CEO (Michael Sullivan), Administrator (Carole Walle) and accounts Administrators Alana Welch & Vanessa Whan who were instrumental in assisting with accounts and record keeping throughout the year.

Well done to the Club Council members for their careful consideration and discipline of expenditure throughout the year, keeping within the tight budgets that were set, this has greatly assisted me in my role.

Consistent upgrades of equipment through grants, sponsorships and funding purchases out of general income means the Club is generally in good shape with regards to standard of equipment. This has helped minimise repair costs and together with our members performing many repairs and maintenance tasks themselves has kept costs down. Thanks to all the members and local businesses providing in kind donations of goods and services throughout the year. These dollars saved are as good as the dollars made.

The financial statements highlight the very high cost of running a modern SLSC and Clubs cannot survive financially without the generous support of sponsors and a successful Supporters' Association.

I sincerely thank the sponsors of our Club, without their support the Club would find it difficult to fulfill its obligations and I hope that all Club members show their full support towards these businesses' that support us. Also, I place on record my appreciation and admiration for the staff and committee of our Supporters Association for their success in what was heading to be an excellent result this year.

In our Centenary season, it is great to be able to report that the Club remains in a strong financial position. When Harold Freeman started things way back in November 1919 I doubt he would have ever imagined a Club with incomes (or expenditures) the size of ours. Even in the 1970s and 1980s it would have been hard to comprehend – that would have been a lot of doors to knock on and a lot of meat tray raffle tickets to sell.

The last few months though has seen a significant loss of income due to the closure of the Supporters Association during the Covid-19 pandemic, but I am very grateful to our staff, Supporters Association, Management Committee and Surf Life Saving Club, Club Council for the prompt action taken to protect the Club's balance sheet so that we can continue to provide our essential community services going forward.
