Presidents Report

Season 2019/2020 was a season like no other I can recall. In March 2020, when I wrote to the membership at the outbreak of COVID 19, I foreshadowed that some difficult decisions would be required if we were to endure. I noted that there would need to be sacrifices and hard work with no guarantee of reward. I said that there would need to be more give than take. I asked for patience and kindness. What I have witnessed in the last three months has been inspirational and humbling.

I have watched our members – who, despite their other passions, are lifesavers first and foremost – march to the beach in waves to attend patrols which were not their own – just to make sure we were covered and our beach was safe. In fact, on many occasions, it became necessary to remind our patrollers to stay a little further apart, such were the numbers and the response. It has been my privilege to chair virtual meetings with the most amazing Committees – both for the Supporters Association and the Surf Club. I have seen the synergy which lives at the point where business smarts and financial acumen meets passion and protection of culture. I have seen these members – all of them volunteers – give hours of their time when, frankly, they did not have them to give and where, in more than a few cases, their own financial or personal circumstances were falling apart. This is our 100th year. Thank you to our Social Director, Karley Lawler, Sue Hanson (and Hanso) and the 100th committee and Courtney Taylor and the Summer Surf Girl committee all of whom worked tirelessly to prepare for many spectacular events to mark this glorious occasion, culminating in our Gala Ball. All of the love and hard work will not be wasted – we will have our celebration! It will be even better!

And finally, I have learned so much about our members. To all of you who have reached out to me and to each other, simply to check in or to ask questions or to offer ideas, help, encouragement or even criticism, I thank you. All of it shows your care for the Club. What I have witnessed is your capacity to keep turning up for each other. Not because it is easy. But because it is right. Because you are Vikings!

More is learned through adversity than through success. Only when adversity comes and surrounds us and a lone voice in the dark calls “Who stands with me?”, do we discover what is real and solid and true. This Season has shown me what is real and solid and true. It wears Green and White. It is mighty! It is us!

I am sure that in future times the 2019/2020 season will be remembered by all of our members for a number of significant reasons. Not only was it a milestone year for the Club, a chance to reflect, celebrate and enjoy our 100th season in green and white, it was also the season that we encountered Covid-19, a global pandemic which grinded our operations to a halt, placed the country into an economic recession and potentially changed the way we live, work and operate forever moving forward.

Whilst we were forced to close our doors for three months in March, 2020 this season should still be remembered by all for the feats that we achieved, the milestones we reached and the special moments that connected our volunteers as members of the Viking tribe. Many of these moments are detailed in this report of annual activities.

As a Club we are pleased to have once again delivered on our core mission of providing excellence in Surf Life Saving services to Currumbin Beach through our surf lifesaving patrols and our member training and education programs. This of course wouldn't be possible without the commitment and dedication of our active members and beach patrollers. To each and every one of our patrollers I thank you for your selfless commitment to our beach operations and lifesaving services. In 2019/2020, 321 of our active volunteers delivered over 7000 volunteer hours on the beach to ensure 41,641 beach patrons visiting Currumbin Beach were provided with a safe aquatic environment. Our Active members gained 237 new lifesaving awards over the course of the season to ensure that the depth of our lifesaving patrols were well resourced against the award requirements under our patrol service agreement and provide sustainable, skilled and well resourced patrol groups into future seasons.

Whilst we didn't get the opportunity to celebrate our 100th Gala Ball we did have the opportunity to come together for a number of centenary year functions throughout the season to help celebrate our 100th season and allow our members both past and present to reminisce on their special moments as Vikings over 100 years. It was fantastic to see a mix of Vikings past and present at our 100th Years of Memories Lifesavers Lunch and other supporting events across the season. Additionally, we were also extremely fortunate to have a Surf Girl representative this season who dedicated her season to training our members, raising vital funds for the Surf Lifesaving Club and promoting Surf Lifesaving education and awareness amongst the Club members and general community over the season. Thank you to our 100th sub committee, our 2020 Surf Girl and all of our members who supported and attended these programs and events.

To our official Club sponsors, thank you for your ongoing commitment to the Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club. Your support we simply couldn't do without. To our members, I really do hope that you take the opportunity where it arises to help support our sponsors in return and show our appreciation for the support they provide our club and its members. The Club was fortunate to receive a number of grants this season to assist with purchasing equipment, upgrading facilities and delivering our lifesaving programs. A big thank you to Sunland Group, Gold Coast City Council, Karen Andrews MP, the DCS fund and the BSEF fund for your support.

Finally I thank our Surf Life Saving Club Council, Supporters Association Management Committee, our standing committees, sub committees and our dedicated and talented staffing group for your commitment and dedication to making this Club the greatest that it can be. Thank you for making this Club so special and I hope that you continue to do so and help us reach even greater heights in the future.

In season 2019/2020 our training and education section focus was primarily on ensuring that our patrolling members and seventeen core patrol groups held the necessary skillset for adherence to our annual Surf Life Saving Queensland Patrol Service Agreement.

A key priority identified by our Training & Education standing committee this season was on ensuring that the Club provides relevant training opportunities to our members, not only benefiting the Club as a whole but also facilitating the opportunity for our Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club members to obtain nationally recognised competencies which can be used externally to surf lifesaving in members professional careers and personal knowledge bases through the introduction of the annual course training calendar.

One of the key focuses of our annual training calendar was the standardisation of emergency care awards to assist with award strengths on patrol. The Club continued with its integration of First Aid and CPR courses as a component of the club based Bronze Medallion/Certificate 2 in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) training syllabus. Again showing the benefits of this integration we were able to process and award a further fifty two new First Aid officers this season to strengthen our patrol roster and add new award members to our members award database.

In season 2018/19 the Club set a new benchmark in training and education and achieved its largest ever increase in awards gained making it a hard one to follow. Despite a premature end to the season due to the Covid-19 pandemic the Club trained a further forty five new Bronze Medallion Holders and thirty one new Surf Rescue Certificate holders this season. It is a tribute to our talented team of Trainers that we are again able to train such a large number of major award holders and provide a pathway for a large number of our active juniors and youth members who are coming through our system and gaining these awards.

We experienced a decrease in the total number of Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management awards gained. Whilst it is pleasing to see members come forward into leadership positions as Patrol Captains this area will be a key focus in the upcoming seasons as part of our strategic plan to ensure that we are identifying future leaders and continue to offer them training courses to ensure they obtain the relevant awards required to hold key positions and have access to a pathway to become a future Patrol Captain and beach leader. Congratulations to all of our members gaining new awards this season and a big welcome to our new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate holders

Finally, thank you to our team of Club trainers, assessors and content experts who make up our education team. The achievements in the training and education section of the Club wouldn't be possible without your dedication and commitment. With the Clubs ever increasing training and educational needs, identifying future trainers and assessors to assist the Club will remain a key focus of future Club strategy.

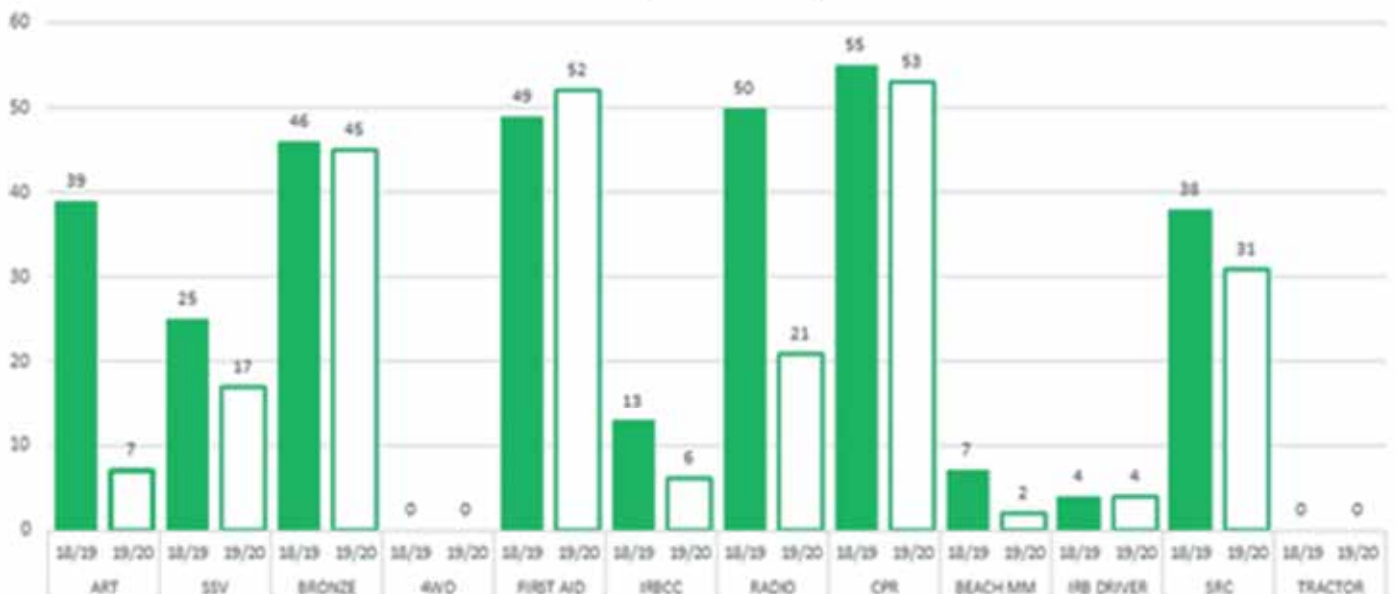

Family ties thrive at Currumbin

FAMILY ties don't come much stronger than in surf clubs and down at the Currumbin Beach Vikings there's a family tree that stands taller than most - it's the Cahill family.

Three branches stem across three generations with the father figures Dick and Mick Cahill at the top of their tree.

The Brisbane-born brothers came into the Vikings as established board paddlers - sharing gold medal Australian podiums in 1970 and 1972 before joining the Vikings for the 1975 Aussie at Dee Why.

And it's there the brothers Cahill, with Dick and wife Robyn and Mick and wife Linley, have been ever since - starting a dynasty that has produced a family of champion lifesavers that continue to make their mark at the Vikings prepare to celebrate the club's Centenary season in 2019-20.

Dick is regarded as one of Australia's premier board paddlers - a two-time Australian representative and multi-National winning Australian champion.

Mick, himself a two-time Australian champion with his brother, is credited with playing a leading role in the success of the club's award winning Junior Club - itself celebrating 50 years in 2018-19.

Dick's boys Stephen and Ben are both celebrated Aus-

Indian Patrol Competition gold medalists and Life Members at the Vikings, born and bred on the beach - and as Currumbin as The Rock itself - Ben alongside Justin Jones and Kerry Gray, elevated to Life Membership just this year.

Stephen and wife Tina and Ben and wife Tara who themselves dedicated their recent seasons to the success of the Junior Club, are all proud parents of their next generation Vikings, who continue to wear the green and white caps.

While Mick's daughter Dana and Hayley also followed in dad's footsteps,

Dana along with Hayley Atkins became Currumbin's first ever female Aussie gold medalists - Dana in the Champion Patrol Team, with cousin Stephen and Hayley Atkins in the under 18 board.

While Hayley also continued the family tradition, becoming the fourth Cahill to claim Aussie Patrol gold while Jim maker brother Joel of 'In The Bin' fame claimed in with Aussie surf teams silver - and is now the most popular of the club's 'Nippers' Age Group Managers.

The next generation of Cahill offspring are already mak-

ing their mark in the surf and pool rescue competitions - with Dana marrying multi-Australian champion and 'Super Surf Camps' founder Bert Dowler - their offspring all chipping into the medal-earning family traditions.

The Cahills will be front and centre when the Vikings kick-start their Centennial celebrations on Sunday, with the 100 Year Family Fun Day Picnic, at Mical Drive on Currumbin Creek from 10am.

The club has become one of the most successful in Australia, winning multiple national, individual and team titles and building momentum up at last year's world lifesaving championships in South Africa.

Vikings storm the waters

THE Currumbin Vikings have taken out their sixth consecutive Australian open pool rescue title on the Gold Coast. Twenty-six Australian lifesaving records were broken yesterday alone, with 10 of those records by the Vikings. Both 21-year-old Prue Davies and 14-year-old Lily Nicholson from Currumbin

won seven gold medals across the weekend, with Nicholson breaking three Australian lifesaving records yesterday. Currumbin teammate Matt Davis won six gold medals across the 600-person championships and broke two Australian records yesterday. The Vikings impressed all weekend and notched 485

points, nearly 100 ahead of Northcliffe (387 points). Maroochydore were third with 340 points. In the masters championships, Tweed Heads & Coolangatta took out the top spot, winning multiple gold medals and breaking several Australian records for a total of 245 points.

Tweed Heads & Coolangatta's Lisa Ferguson set the only world lifesaving record of the day in the women's 35-39 year-old 100m Manikin Carry with Pins in 59.84 seconds. Terrigal came in second with 181 points, while Kurrawa finished third with 135 points. Across the championships selected individuals represent-

ed their states and accumulated points for the interstate championships pointscore. After sharing the top spot in 2018, Queensland sneaked ahead of NSW to win the interstate championship with a total of 536 points. NSW came in second with 489 points and Western Australia third on 462 points.

A major focus of the Supporters Association this financial year was the completion of our first stage of Club renovations. It was with great fortune that the Government introduced a rescue package in the form of the Job Keeper payment. This rescue package was promptly adopted and endorsed by the Management Committee giving much needed relief to many.

In the proceeding months I am proud to say that our staff have remained in constant contact with each other and in continued contact with the Club, steeling our reserve and further strengthening the bond that we already share as a staffing group and of course members of a community organisation. Our staff are currently working on preparing the venue for reopening and their time and effort to achieve this should be commended.

With the recent changes and imposed regulations the Supporters Association is working tirelessly behind the scenes to create a business model that can deliver ongoing profits to the Surf Life Saving Club whilst operating effectively and efficiently within the restrictive constraints of the Covid -19 pandemic. Rest assured the safety and wellbeing of our staff and patrons is of the highest priority.

Special mention should be given to our CEO, Michael Sullivan and the Supporters Association Management Committee who have again continued to guide the Club in a positive direction. Their support has been unwavering through both the good and the not so good times more recently. This level of support is very much appreciated by myself and this sentiment is shared throughout the management and staffing teams. Our members are undoubtedly the foundation of this Club and we as a team will strive to make Currumbin Beach Vikings attractive to existing members and new members alike.

The audited financial statements of Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the year ended 30 April 2020 are presented later in this Report. I can attest that all expenditure has been made in the best interests of the Club and its members.

Once again, I would like to thank the Club CEO (Michael Sullivan), Administrator (Carole Walle) and accounts Administrators Alana Welch & Vanessa Whan who were instrumental in assisting with accounts and record keeping throughout the year.

Well done to the Club Council members for their careful consideration and discipline of expenditure throughout the year, keeping within the tight budgets that were set, this has greatly assisted me in my role.

Consistent upgrades of equipment through grants, sponsorships and funding purchases out of general income means the Club is generally in good shape with regards to standard of equipment. This has helped minimise repair costs and together with our members performing many repairs and maintenance tasks themselves has kept costs down. Thanks to all the members and local businesses providing in kind donations of goods and services throughout the year. These dollars saved are as good as the dollars made.

The financial statements highlight the very high cost of running a modern SLSC and Clubs cannot survive financially without the generous support of sponsors and a successful Supporters' Association.

I sincerely thank the sponsors of our Club, without their support the Club would find it difficult to fulfill its obligations and I hope that all Club members show their full support towards these businesses' that support us. 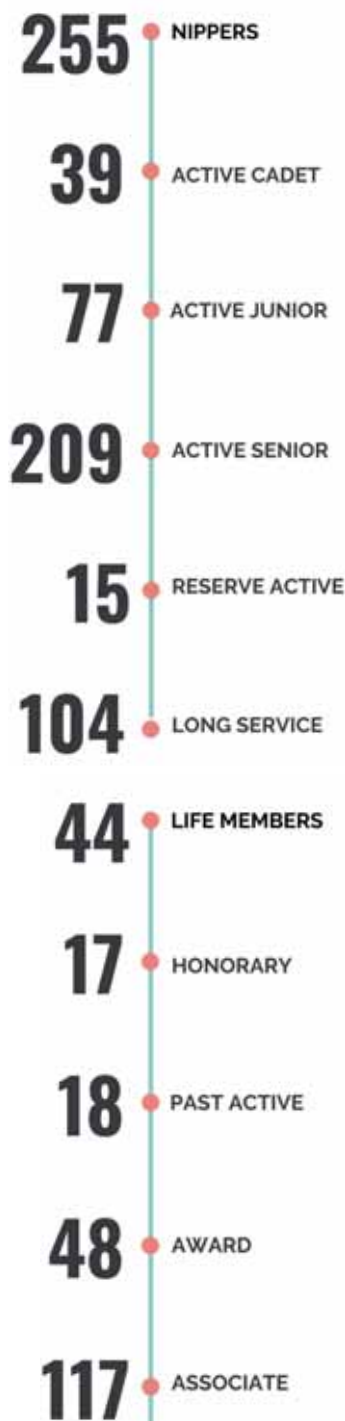
