# Presidents Report

# Lifesaving Report

## Andrew McIntyre



Season 2021/2022 has quickly ended and has again brought success for Currumbin. We have successfully achieved our primary core objective, that being zero preventable deaths. This achievement is not a trivial fact as it underpins our very formation, our very existence and drives everything that we do. From initiating our Nippers to developing our SRC's, educating and refining the skills of our Bronze Medallion holders and crafting and polishing these skills through intensive training and competitions. The overall success of the club rests on many shoulders and that is due to you, a fellow Viking.

As Club Captain, I appreciate and congratulate every member that volunteered their time, not only for Currumbin SLSC but also for going beyond, supporting other community organisations, such as the Disabled Surfers Association, Surfing the Spectrum and Currumbin RSL. The support of these organisations is a positive reflection of the integrity and characteristics of what it means to be a surf lifesaver and a Viking.

As we continue to embrace the VIKINGS Mantra, it is great to see members growing awareness of our cultural expectations. This is particularly evident with members actively using our communication platforms for patrols and recognising that we are all 'one club' and we always having our 'fellow Viking's back'. The results of understanding our cultural expectations and buying into the VIKINGS mantra is shared success for all of our members, be it wearing the red and yellow or the green and white.

With interstate travel resuming, beach attendance numbers continued to rise with a total of 49,403 visitations. Our patrol members completed a successful 6,672 hours with zero preventable deaths and 74 First Aid treatments. Through proactivity and public relations, we conducted 971 advisory and preventative actions, resulting in only 2 recorded rescues for the season. This is an outstanding result and a testament to the leadership of our Patrol Captains and the vigilance of our members that preventing a rescue, is always better than performing a rescue.

So, thank you to every member who volunteered their time for Currumbin and surf lifesaving. Your generosity and vigilance have ensured that the community can enjoy our beautiful beach and return home safely. I would like to especially thank our Patrol Captains for their leadership, commitment to improvement and support throughout the season. Also, I would like to acknowledge our long service members who continue to patrol and share their experience and expertise with our new members. Thank you to our Vice-Club Captain, Pat Trevor-Jones for your support as well as our IRB Captain, Werner Piehler and First Aid Officer, Josh Harmer. Finally, a huge and sincere thank you to Carole Walle, who works tirelessly and goes above and beyond to support surf lifesaving and ensure the weekly needs of our patrols are met.

Attendance by Date





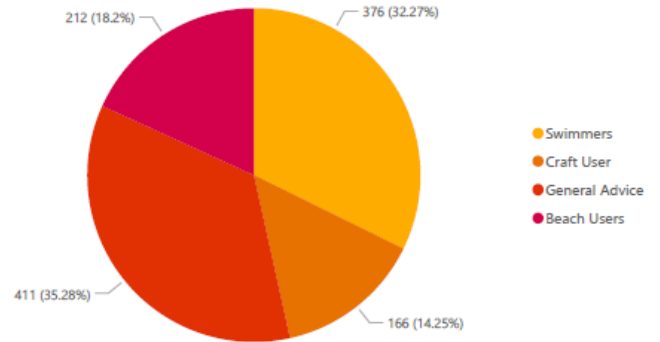

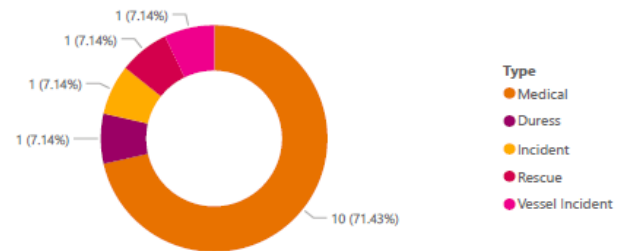

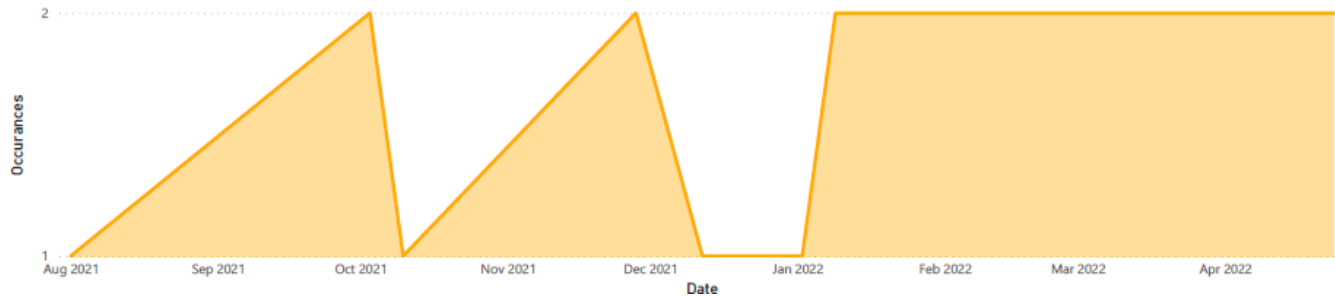

# Training & Education Report

It has been a busy season for the Training and Education Committee for 2021/22. Firstly, I would like to thank all our trainers, assessors, facilitators and officials for their dedication and the hours of work they've put in. Throughout this season we have ensured 210 members have remained proficient to patrol our beach, trained 47 new bronze and SRC members and 13 people have attained an IRB award. I would also like to extend a thanks to all of those who contributed to water safety for training throughout the season, and those who assisted with our proficiencies. Your contribution is invaluable and doesn't go unnoticed, you all exemplify the Viking Way.

We are very lucky here at Curumbin to have some fantastic senior officials who are keen to pass on their skills and mentor new officials. This season our officials successfully met our officials ratio at major carnivals to support and enable our competitors to participate in surf sports competition. Congratulations goes out to Ben Cahill for stepping up to begin learning how to be a starter for the open division. Without these passionate members dedicating their time to our surf sports we wouldn't be able to compete, so thank you again for all the Vikings Officials have done throughout the season. If there is anyone interested in becoming a surf official for the upcoming season, please reach out to the Club Administrator so that we can help you to have the best spot on the beach to watch all the action.

This season Luke Smith and Werner Piehler have again had a successful season with their IRB courses producing highly skilled crewies and drivers which has been instrumental in keeping our IRB's operational across all our patrols. An amazing 61% of patrol members now hold their IRB awards, which exceeds our goal of 35% of patrol members with IRB awards, a goal set 5 years ago that has been achieved through the high-quality training delivered by Luke and Werner. Well done! It has also been fantastic to see so many new drivers and crewies also taking part in IRB competition, which is not only a great way to keep active in the cooler months, but also an excellent opportunity to continue to improve their skills as IRB personnel.

At the beginning of the season, we had two bronze medallion courses and two SRC courses run in quick succession, with a mixture of skills as a result of new and returning club members, as well as our nippers progressing into achieving their bronze and SRC awards. I would like to extend a thanks to the external support Curumbin SLSC received from John Hamrey from Bilinga SLSC, Tonya Pade from Pacific SLSC and Kerrilyn French from BHMP SLSC. Steve Cahill did an excellent job once again with the SRC's, with SRC members walking away with extensive knowledge of rescue techniques as a result of Steve's expertise in this area. Thanks also goes to Sam Dick for contributing time towards bronze training around his busy schedule coaching at the club.

Being new to the role of CTO, I've appreciated the kindness and support from all Curumbin SLSC members as I transition into the role. I would particularly like to thank Carole Walle, Michael Sullivan, Ben Munro and Courtney Taylor for their assistance and advice. I hope we can continue to grow in the training and education space, and that more Vikings, such as Ethan Wilson, will take up the challenge of becoming a trainer and join our team. 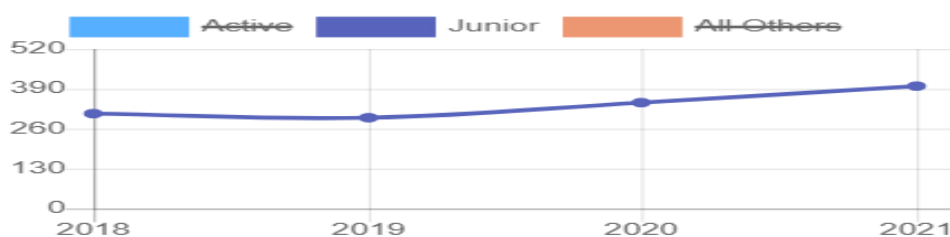
# Junior Activities Report

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2022

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The club council has prepared the financial report on the basis that the association is a non reporting entity because there are no users dependent on a general purpose financial report. This financial report is therefore a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)*.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the following significant accounting policies, which the club council has determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

(a) Income Tax

The club claims a tax exemption under section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act as being established for community services purposes.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

PPE is carried at cost, independent of members' valuation less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Excluding freehold land, the depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(d) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of the reporting period the association determines whether there is any evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2022

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements arising from wages and salaries and annual leave and long service leave for employees with greater than 10 years service at balance sheet date, have been measured at their nominal amount. Contributions are made by the Association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(h) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or part of an item of the expense.

Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

(i) Comparatives

Comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year where required by accounting standards or as a result of changes in accounting policy.

(i) COVID-19

Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc. closed on 23 March 2020 due to COVID-19 government restrictions. No rent was received from Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc from April 2020 until December 2021. With restrictions lifting partially from 15 May 2020, the association implemented a COVID SAFE plan and re-opened its facilities on 16 June 2020. Due to the lifting of some restrictions, the committee does not consider it necessary to write down the carrying value of inventory or property, plant and equipment. Given the association's cash and net asset position the committee considers it appropriate to prepare the financial report on the going concern basis.
