#### **MESSAGE FROM THE EDITOR...**

Historians now believe the Vikings explored as far as Asia, Northern Africa and the Americas, and their artifacts have been found in at least 37 countries from Afghanistan to Canada.

The ability to sail so far can only be achieved through a shared vision and belief and unwavering cooperation. There is no doubt the Vikings conquered the world because they were one unit. Just as we are One Club.

Finally, the Vikings revered their elders and their departed. They celebrated great Vikings, living and dead, and told stories about brave deeds for generations. This can only be because they loved one another and, above all, simply loved being Vikings.

Upon reflection, how much we seem to have in common with our ancient brothers and sisters. May each of you leave an indelible mark on the Vikings, in your own unique way, which will be spoken about in revered terms for generations to come.



#### A REFLECTION FROM HEAD COACH, KURT WILSON

What I learned and reconfirmed at Aussies 2023...

- A positive team culture is the best performance platform we can have. This campaign has shown us all that the environment we live and breathe has unmatched positive performance outcomes across everything we do. I've seen you all grow into close friends, supportive rivals, loving team mates, loyal brothers and sisters and most importantly developed an athlete-led unity that I would argue is one of the best on the beach. I'm confident the culture you've all played a critical role in developing can't be broken by anyone, anywhere at anytime!
- Strong self belief is endless in its ability to power performance, drive process and deliver personal growth. This week I've watched Vikings dream, believe and achieve one of the greatest feats in Australian Surf Sports and are now crowned Australian Champions. I witnessed personal goals being achieved race after race and watched you all attack your races with pride, conviction and the confidence of champions. The heart and soul poured into relay performances was inspiring and that proved to me that positive self talk, personal self belief and organic belief in team mates and the willingness to open up and have the freedom to achieve is crucial in the evolution of our Club and the ongoing performance of us all as individuals. The greater our self image and self belief, the greater heights we will reach as a Club!
- There is a turn of the tide in surf sports domination with a youthful flare and a focus on youth development. With a young athlete base, for us at Currumbin we have the opportunity to redefine and reshape the competitive landscape for many years to come. It's the work and commitment we strive to achieve now and beyond that will thrust us into great stead moving forward. To be at podium level in the U19's arena across marquee events like the U19 Male Taplin, U19 Male Surf Teams, Surf Race and the astonishing clean sweep of the U19 Male Board Race and U19 Women's Surf Boats, we have the greatest opportunity in Australia to build momentum, promote pathways and embed sustainable success!



#### A REFLECTION FROM HEAD COACH, KURT WILSON

The success and highs and celebrations in the shining lights and glitter of the Australian Championships are only possible because of the sheer hard work, dedication, determination and commitment that happens in the dark and cold depths of winter when nobody's looking. Glory only comes from self reflection, when fatigue, pain and suffering is a lifestyle choice year round that is worn as a badge of honour only seen by you and that nobody ever notices. Think of the Brennan family racing down the M1, replacing their dining table for the back seat of a car in the middle of the night and early morning hours to attend training sessions on the GC before and after school, or the Green brothers battling freezing NSW winters to get ski and board fit for the world championships and their move to QLD. Think of EJ Forsyth fitting in gym sessions at 4:30am and flag and sprint sessions in the dark and cold of winter evenings because she's working full time at the hospital and studying full time in any spare minute available. Think of those in the squad who completed the morning swimming sets or run sets in the cold wind and rain after the craft sets. Think of the boat crews launching off the ramp in the pitch black year round with head lamps and thermos on. That's what is behind the lights, glitter, glory and success...it's not always sexy, it's not always enjoyable but it's always those who are willing to do what others aren't, knowing that the kilometres banked now, the sessions completed now, the pain and suffering now are the earned centimetres and millimetres and spring board required to win an Australian Championship in April.

Club culture, club pride, belonging, loyalty and friendship eats cash for breakfast. In sports, "Culture" is thrown around a lot. It's usually started in a board room and shaped into something that can be pitched in an effort to have people act in a way the organisation wants. What does that really mean? Culture is the shared characteristics of a group which encompasses social behaviours, people, interactions, relationships and direction. Some cultures are widespread, and have a large number of people who associate themselves with those particular values, beliefs and practices. At Currumbin, that's us. We have this in its purest form. Culture is our currency. We have an organic feeling that being a Viking adds value to our lives in an intangible way. That it's more of a feeling than an adjective.



#### A REFLECTION FROM HEAD COACH, KURT WILSON

It's the little things that give you tingles like when you hear the phrase "Mighty Mighty Vikings" bellowing around the beach, and knowing the phase's origin. It's the feeling that you belong to something bigger than yourself. It's the feeling you get of shared success when the Club performs and the warm fuzziness of seeing your Club mates succeed. It's the emotion you feel when you race your heart out or scream your lungs out for the lifesaver relay teams side by side with all sections of the club knowing it means everything to everyone right then and there. It's the "hell yeah!" you naturally say when you get an update that the Chilli Pepperz have gone back to back.



Culture for all to see and Vikings to feel. On Saturday afternoon our Club culture was showcased in the most organic and authentic way imaginable. Without any formal communication 150+ Vikings gravitated to the beach front amphitheatre to support our beachies, our Viking clan intent on being apart of what might unfold, hopeful of witnessing something special and dedicated to supporting our beach Queen EJ as she embarked on winning her fifth straight Australian Beach Flags title. All sections of the Club were packed in and clapped, screamed and bellowed loudly. Our famous phrase echoing as One Club, all feeling proud that our barracking and cheering might just make the difference! As EJ's lifelong friends and lifelong Club mates Sam, Tim, and Matt literally stood in her corner holding towels, drink bottles, ice and red bull and with a contingent of 150 strong Vikings howling the amphitheatre roof off, EJ won Gold and etched her name in the record books earning her own slice of surf sports history...of course she did! What no one saw coming however was the sheer beauty of 150 Vikings chanting her name in unison, "EJ" "EJ" bellowing and echoing across the foreshore that was fuelled by pride, passion and admiration. We were part of something bigger than ourselves, we were part of history, we were part of greatness! In this moment, it dawned on me that "Culture" eats cash for breakfast every day of the week. The currency we trade in at Currumbin can't be converted, it can't be bought, it can't be sold and it never runs out when you're a Viking. It's an unlimited line of credit and Vikings spend up large in whatever our endeavour.

As each of our Patrol Groups attend their final patrols for the 2022/2023 season, we want to




#### MARCH STAFF APPRECIATION AWARD WINNER

#### **APRIL-MAY PROGRESS UPDATE**




The Vikings were recently announced as a successful grant recipient of \$35,000 worth of funding from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund. This funding will be used towards the construction of change room facilities in our new Nipper Club and Community Centre to cater for people with a disability.

Currumbin MP, Laura Gerber attended the Club to discuss the project and drop off some new marquees.

The Project team have completed the rear retaining wall backfilling and are 80% progressed on the level 1 structure. The roof has also been installed on the building.

Works onsite are currently 4 weeks behind schedule based on the original contract date compared to the current target date. Practical Completion is forecasted for 30 June 2023.









#### **CBV POOL RESCUE**

#### **2023 POOL RESCUE SEASON**

The Vikings have a proud history in the pool and boast some of the most exceptional and medalled Pool Rescue athletes in the World.

Pool rescue competition has gone from strength to strength, with competitors testing their rescue skills with events including manikin tows and carries, obstacle swims, line throws, tube swims carrying patients and team events. Pool rescue skills have become essential for athletes in consideration to be selected for Australian surf lifesaving teams, enhancing the importance of these skills for surf lifesaving competitors.

The first competition this season will be the Gold Coast Championships on 27 May 2023. The QLD State Championships will be held in Cairns on 22 and 23 July 2023, with the Australian Championships being held from 4 to 6 August 2023 at the Southport Aquatic Centre, Gold Coast.

Vikings pool rescue training will commence from Monday, 8 May at 6pm at the Miami Aquatic Centre. See you all there!
