PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2023/24 season was another busy yet successful year for the Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club, and I am pleased to present this report reflecting on some of our achievements and challenges. I would like to express my sincere gratitude to all our members, whose remarkable efforts have been instrumental in the continued success and growth of our Club. Over the past 12 months, we have strengthened our Vikings values and remained dedicated to achieving our strategic goals and key priorities.

This season, we were privileged to operate out of our new Junior Activities and Community Centre, a multi-million-dollar facility that has finally come to fruition. It was wonderful to see our Nippers return to this state-of-the-art venue, alongside the launch of Vika Events and Kinship Café, both essential components of the Currumbin Beach Vikings Supporters Club.

I extend my sincere gratitude to all levels of Government - City of Gold Coast, Queensland Government and Federal Government, and all our sponsors for their support this season. Your financial contributions have been invaluable, supporting various aspects of our Club, from the new building to essential patrolling equipment. Additionally, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Club Treasurer Robert Dunlop in supporting and driving the Qld Lifesavers Appeal in 2023, which provided a substantial financial boost for the Club. Below is a summary report on the key areas within the Club.





Lifesaving and Education

This season marked the beginning of Peter Harding's tenure as Club Captain. Peter has worked diligently in his role, adeptly learning the responsibilities whilst being supported by his lifesaving committee to ensure that all patrol obligations were met. Our dedicated patrolling members have tirelessly completed 7,690.11 beach patrol hours, continuously ensuring the safety of our community and visitors from September to May. We extend our gratitude to all the Patrol Captains for their unwavering commitment and outstanding service throughout the 2023-24 season.

Throughout the season, we had a total of 55,000+beachgoers. Our members conducted 832 preventative actions, responded to 54 first aid cases, and carried out 4 rescues. Our Chief Training Officer – Abbey Holyman and her team of trainers and assessors worked tirelessly to enhance our patrol strength, resulting in the certification of 41 new Bronzies, 19 SRC awardees, 36 new First Aiders, 7 ART awardees, 4 new IRB Drivers and 5 Crewies. With the implementation of the Axcelerate online system in September, our trainers were met with some early challenges. I congratulate Abbey and her team on their ability to manage the teething issues and having a successful season in education and training.

With thanks to the support of the Queensland Government and Community Bank Tugun, we began the season with a brand new SSV to support our patrol operations, along with new rescue boards, radios, and other equipment to ensure we are rescue ready.

I would also like to extend my congratulations to our eight members who were honoured with Australian Honours by receiving the National Service Medal this season: Grant Harrison, Grant Epple, Peter Nibbs, Paul O'Shea, Brett Ross, Ron Anderson, Mark Quinlan, and Lauren Quinlan. This esteemed recognition highlights your exceptional service to Surf Life Saving and Currumbin Beach Vikings, and it is a distinction of which you should be extremely proud.

Membership Services

Our membership base and active patrol numbers have remained steady, with a total of 927 Vikings members and approximately 8,000 members including the Supporters Club. Under the leadership of Kristy Smith, the Membership Services Committee has achieved many significant accomplishments this season. These range from supporting our youth programs to organising numerous social events that have fostered camaraderie and unity within the Vikings community.

From the Annual Bowls Day to the newly introduced "Sunday Sippers," our members have enjoyed a variety of social gatherings throughout the season. Special thanks also to John Lacheca for driving the Vintage Vikings Social event, which aims to bring together all eras of our membership.



Junior Activities

This season, the Junior Activities Committee (JAC) moved into the Club's new state-of-the-art facility, working diligently to establish new operations and systems for the CBV Nipper Program. Under the leadership of Louise Waller and her Committee, and with the support of many volunteer office bearers and nipper families, a successful launch of the new building was held. I extend my congratulations to the Junior Activities Committee for an outstanding season.

With 285 Nippers registered, it was gratifying to witness the development of our future lifesavers as they learnt essential lifesaving and surf sport skills throughout the summer. I also extend my thanks to all the hardworking volunteer members who ensure the smooth operation of the Nipper Program each weekend.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Surf Sports

Our Surf Sports section continue to demonstrate outstanding success, unity, and camaraderie both on and off the beach. The season began with the Pool Rescue Team winning the overall Point Score, reclaiming the top spot on the podium. From August 2023 to April 2024, our athletes showed immense dedication to their training, which was reflected in their excellent results throughout the season.



This year, we had 23 Surf Boat Crews who performed admirably in various carnivals, including the ASRL Australian Championships. Our Mighty Viking athletes represented at all levels, from the Point Danger Branch to Australian Representative Teams. Notably, our Club can boast impressive statistics: 17 members were selected for the PDB Rep Team, 12 members for the Interstate Pool Rescue Teams, 1 member competed in the SLSA Super Surf League Teams, and 6 Vikings Surf Boat Crews participated in the Interstate Surf Boat Representative Teams.

We are particularly proud of our 17 members who achieved the highest representative honours in their selections into the Australian Lifesaving Open and Youth Teams, competing both nationally and internationally. These individuals and teams are recognised later in the report. The extensive representation of Currumbin in these teams is a testament to the strength of our surf sports program and the quality of coaching provided at our Club, covering a diverse range of surf sports disciplines.

From our grassroots Nippers to our mighty masters, our members have supported the Surf Sports program with pride and great success, from local carnivals to the Australian Championships.



Supporters Club

The Supporters Club Committee and staff have worked tirelessly in navigating another highly successful season. The introduction of two additional Supporters Club business units, Kinship Café and Vika Events has been an exciting development, fostering growth that directly benefits the Surf Life Saving Club. I thank our membership base for their unwavering support of the Supporters Club businesses over the past 12 months.

As I write this report, construction on the Oceanway is impacting business operations around the clubhouse, making our support more crucial than ever. The Supporter's Club is seizing this opportunity to modernise and optimize the facilities, so please stay tuned for updates. With the impacts of the Oceanway construction, our budget for the upcoming season will be tight and our annual donation has been reduced as a consequence of downturn in business.

I particularly acknowledge the leadership of David Dwight and his Committee and commend the outstanding efforts of all the staff at the Supporters Club, Kinship Café, and Vika Events. Your hard work, patience, and dedication are deeply appreciated and integral to the Currumbin Beach Vikings family.

The success of these businesses will lay the foundation for the Club for many years to come as we look to diversify the Club's revenue streams into the future. I encourage all members to get right behind these businesses and support the businesses that support our programs and operations.

Once again, the Currumbin Beach Vikings Supporters' Association provided us with vital funding support across the financial year. We secured a number of grants from the City of Gold Coast, Tugun Community Bank, Active Clubs & the DTIS who provided funding towards our facilities and beach equipment. SLSA and SLSQ provided funding to assist the Club with the purchase of lifesaving equipment and maintenance of our facilities.



I would like to welcome on board our newest sponsors - Siera Group, Bridgestone Currumbin and Currumbin Dental Care. Rest assured that our committees and staff are working tirelessly to ensure that we remain prudent with our expenditure during this time. We are also working hard behind the scenes to ensure that despite these adverse conditions we maximise patronage to our venue and revenues derived outside of the main business. It has long been my experience that every time the Vikings are faced with adversity—we rise. It's part of our blueprint. It's who we are. So, whilst the project presents a major challenge, we will use this as an opportunity to band together, support the businesses that support our Club and come out the other side stronger than ever!

Our efforts across the season have put us in a much improved position as a team and as a Club. The challenge is now ahead of us to build on that foundation. Everyone at the Currumbin Surf Life Saving Club is committed to making our Club the best it can be, and we all look forward to advancing the cause with relentless energy and optimism in the coming season.

FINANCE REPORT

Robert Dunlop

The audited financial statements of Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc., for the year ending 30 April 2024 are presented later in this report. I am pleased to report that the Club has had a solid year in revenue raising while managing its costs and risks within its limits. The net result is a pleasing small operating surplus for 2024.

The year has had many challenges with the finalisation of the Junior Activities and Community Centre ("JACC"), the raising of bank debt to complete the payment of the JACC, increasing costs on many of our key expense items (particularly insurance and electricity), as well as our customers and members facing increased living and mortgage costs, to which we are always sensitive. At the same time, we have been able to re-equip ourselves with a new Side by Side Vehicle (previously known as an ATV); two new surf boats and various other upgrades.



Moving into 2024/25, the Oceanwall / Seawall project, while good in the medium / long term for Currumbin Beach, poses significant and near-term risks for the Vikings. In short, our car park will be compromised over the next 7 months, and at times will not be accessible at all. We have been working with the Supporters' Club as to the likely impact and we are of the view that business will be very challenging at this time. While both Clubs are seeking to mitigate damage and losses to our businesses and activities, we are both concerned as to the negative financial impact during this time. Both SLSC and Supporters have made multiple submissions to GCCC in the lead up to the works commencing—we believe there will be some concessions, but these are not known at the date of printing this report.

Despite this, members will note that this work stated on 1 May 2024 commencing with excavation around the car park exit with the Club being hard to access with the road safety barriers and black hoardings. This is a challenging time.

Consequently, with decreased revenue, the 2024/25 SLSC budget is very tight. Indeed, to maintain current SLSC activities, the budget shows a cash deficit for the year which will be funded by the 2024 cash surplus. Club Council has had to make some hard decisions about cost budgeting and activity curtailment for 2024/25.

I would like to acknowledge Paul O'Shea, the previous Finance Director, who passed on this role last year with the Club in a solid financial position. I plan to stand on the shoulders of the great man and pass the role on with an even stronger club when my time comes. I also acknowledge the great work of Michael Sullivan (our Club CEO); Sharon Brennan (Operations Manager); Carole Walle (Administrator) and Vanessa Whan (Accounts Administrator). I would like to thank the entire Surf Club Council led by Club President John Brennan, including Kristy Smith, Peter Harding, Andrew McIntyre, Kurtis Smith, Abbey Holyman, and Louise Waller. This entire team has worked well together to manage the budgets and provide the excellent services with disciplined enthusiasm. Also, I note that the Supporters Club Treasurer, Paul Phelan will be standing down at the end of this year. Paul has been a wonderful partner for me, we have worked well together, and he is leaving the Supporters Club with very solid financial discipline.

On a final note, I would like to make a comment about volunteers and their role, not only at the Vikings but in Surf Clubs generally. This may seem strange in a finance report, but managing finance involves managing risk. Our volunteers are our greatest strength but also our greatest weakness. It was not until I joined the Club Council that I appreciated the enormity of the workload our volunteers manage. It is staggering, it is superhuman, it is genuine. They are the life and blood of our Club and if we lose one, we are left with a massive void. If we lost two, we have real problems. Please be generous with our volunteers, please be respectful, please say thanks.

SUPPORTERS' CLUB REPORT

TRAINING & EDUCATION REPORT

The 2023/24 season was a busy one with the introduction of a new online system AXcelerate introduced by SLSQ for Bronze and SRC courses. Currumbin's trainers and assessors adapted quickly to the program, with a big thanks to Sharon Brennan for the countless hours she dedicated to ensuring all paperwork was submitted for processing. It has certainly been a teething process getting used to the new program, and we thank all members for their patience whilst we learn the ropes.

This season saw through four Bronze courses and two SRC courses run by Paul O'Shea, John Costigan, Steve 'Spider' Cahill', Sharon Brennan, and Abbey Holyman. In the interest of trying something new, a course run by Paul O'Shea was run in February 2024, where Currumbin extended the invite to members from other clubs in Point Danger Branch. We saw members from Palm Beach, Tugun and Rainbow Bay attend, which was a nice way for our new members to meet people from other surf clubs, and for those from other clubs to have an insight into what it means to be a Viking.

A similar approach was taken by our IRB trainers Werner Piehler and Peter Hallett who facilitated an IRB drivers and crew course before the season commenced in 2023. Currumbin, Brisbane Lifesaving Services and Rainbow Bay worked together to put together a course that allowed members to experience a variety of different surf conditions across Currumbin Beach and Rainbow Bay. Thank you also goes to Tristan Boal for his time supporting the course, transporting gear and getting in the boat to help teach our new drivers and crewies.

This will be an initiative Currumbin will carry into next season too. Our proficiency days across the 2023/24 season gave our members a variety of different conditions to contend with. 



5 YEAR GENDER COMPARISON

The financial report covers Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association, registered and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the Club Council's opinion the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Material accounting policy information relating to the preparation of these financial statements are presented below, and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Material Accounting Policy Information

(a) Revenue and other income

Revenue from contracts with customers

Revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of control of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Association expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

Generally the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

None of the revenue streams of the Association have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12 months between receipt of funds and satisfaction of performance obligations.

Specific revenue streams

The revenue recognition policies for the principal revenue streams of the Association are:

Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

(a) Revenue and other income

Specific revenue streams

Interest Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Grant Revenue

Grants with conditions attached which must be satisfied before the contributions will be received will be recognised as revenue only when those conditions are satisfied.

When grant revenue is received whereby the Association incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

Fundraising and Membership Income

The Association has implemented AASB 15 which requires membership and fundraising income to be reported in line with the relevant period.

Fundraising income is held as a liability on the statement of financial position and recognised as income at the time of the event.

Supporters Contributions

Contributions are recognised in accordance with AASB 1058 *Income for Not-fot-Profit Entities*. Under AASB 1058 the Association is required to analyse their funding arrangements to determine wether the conditions specified in each arrangement are considered to be 'sufficiently specific' to assess if the arrangement falls within the scope of AASB 15. The specificity of performance obligations specified in an arrangement affects the accounting for the arrangement which will result in either - potential income deferral under AASB 15; or - immediate income recognition under AASB 1058

(b) Income tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act* 1997.

(c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(d) Inventories

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition, which is the deemed cost.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for significantly less than fair value have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Land

Land is measured using the revaluation model.

Buildings, Plant and equipment

Buildings, plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

(f) Financial instruments

Financial assets

Classification

On initial recognition, the Association classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

- amortised cost.
- fair value through other comprehensive income equity instrument (FVOCI equity)

Amortised cost

The Association's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position.

Fair value through other comprehensive income

Equity instruments

The Association has a strategic investment in an unlisted entity over which are they do not have significant influence nor control. The Association has made an irrevocable election to classify these equity investments as fair value through other comprehensive income as they are not held for trading purposes.

Trade receivables

Impairment of trade receivables have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses.

The amount of the impairment is recorded in a separate allowance account with the loss being recognised in finance expense. Once the receivable is determined to be uncollectable then the gross carrying amount is written off against the associated allowance.

Where the Association renegotiates the terms of trade receivables due from certain customers, the new expected cash flows are discounted at the original effective interest rate and any resulting difference to the carrying value is recognised in profit or loss.

Financial liabilities

The financial liabilities of the Association comprise trade payables, bank and other loans.

(g) Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period the Association determines whether there is evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where an indicator exists and regardless for indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cashgenerating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

(h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(i) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits, those benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on high quality corporate bond rates, with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

(j) Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

The Association has adopted all standards which became effective for the first time at 30 April 2024, the adoption of these standards has not caused any material adjustments to the reported financial position, performance or cash flow of the Association.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The Club Council make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions. At the time of signing this report the Club Council have assessed no indicators exist to suggest impairment is required to be recognised on the Associations property, plant and equipment.

Key estimates - grant income

For many of the grant agreements received, the determination of whether the contract includes sufficiently specific performance obligations was a significant judgement involving discussions with a number of parties at the Association, review of the proposal documents prepared during the grant application phase and consideration of the terms and conditions.

Grants received by the Association have been accounted for under both AASB 15 and AASB 1058 depending on the terms and conditions and decisions made.

If this determination was changed then the revenue recognition pattern would be different from that recognised in these financial statements.

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF CURRUMBIN BEACH VIKINGS SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30 April 2024, the Statement of Profit or Loss for the year ended, Statement of cashflows, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the responsible persons declaration on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.

In our opinion, the financial report of Currumbin Beach Vikings Surf Life Saving Club Inc is in accordance with the Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012, including:

- Giving a true and fair view of the association's financial position as at 30 April 2024 and of its financial performance for the year then ended; and
- Complying with the Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the association in accordance with ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110: Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other Matter - Comparative Data

We were not the appointed auditor in prior period ended 30 April 2023. Our procedures on opening balances were to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about whether the opening balances contain misstatements that materially affect the current period's financial statements by:

- (a) determining whether the prior period's closing balances have been correctly brought forward to the current period or, when appropriate, have been restated;
- (b) determining whether the opening balance reflect the application of appropriate accounting policies; and
- (c) performing specific audit procedures to obtain evidence regarding the opening balances.

While we provide no opinion on the completeness and accuracy of the comparative data, our audit report is not qualified with regards to this matter.

Other Matter – Fixed assets

The financial information presented on the Statement of financial position includes \$2.04m in fixed asset additions. While are confident the total value appears true and fair, we provide no opinion on the classification of these additions as classes of property, plant and equipment due to limitations on description of assets.

Other Matter – Insurance expense

The financial information presented on the Statement of profit and loss includes \$92,788 in insurance expense for the year due to historic prepayments written down. This expense is not a true reflection of actual insurance premiums paid during the year, and reflects errors in prior year insurance expense reported.

Other Matter - Stock on hand

The financial information presented on the Statement of financial position includes \$35,332 in inventories related to merchandise stock held. We did not complete a stocktake and therefore provide no opinion on the value reported.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF CURRUMBIN BEACH VIKINGS SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the association to meet the requirements of Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 and for such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the committee is responsible for assessing the association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the committee either intends to liquidate the association or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

The committee is responsible for overseeing the association's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this financial report.

We communicate with the committee regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.


