MESSAGE FROM CLUB CAPTAIN - PETER HARDING

We are well underway with patrols. A huge thank you to our volunteer members who have completed their rostered patrols over the past 5 weekends and thank you to those members who were unable to make their rostered patrol, let their Patrol Captain/ Club Captain or Carole know by return text and completed a make up patrol.

It is important that we all exercise patrol etiquette and two-way communication. If you cannot make your patrol, please let us know, reach out for a sub through the Currumbin Beach Vikings Patrolling Members Facebook Page or ask someone you know to do a patrol swap. If you don't turn up to patrol, it will be recorded as a 'no show'.

Why is it important to communicate? We need to ensure that we have all our awards covered as per our patrol service agreement and that we have ample members on patrol to service the beach.

If you miss your rostered patrol, please undertake a make up patrol to negate the no show. This year we will be monitoring patrol attendance and checking in with you once we see you have missed a few patrols. In most cases there is a reason why, and this can be easily overcome by doing a full makeup patrol.

A reminder to competitors that you are required to completed 25 hours minimum of patrol for active members (Jan 1 to Dec 31) and must fulfil your patrol obligations to be eligible to compete. Active Reserve Members are required to completed 12.5 patrol hours. If you do not meet your patrol obligations or are in default of 3 patrols, you will be unable to be nominated for carnivals.

NEW GOVERNMENT WIRELESS NETWORK (GWN) RADIOS HAVE ARRIVED

Great news, SLSQ has delivered our new GWN Radios which are now in operation on our patrols. All award-based members who will be patrolling, training, or using radios are asked to complete the new GWN Induction on their SLS Members Portal. The induction will take approximately 15-20 minutes to complete and is simply a series of short videos to watch and answer some basic questions.


How to access the GWN Induction?

Simply log onto your members portal. Click on eLearning and select the GWN Radio Induction on the home page. The videos will provide an overview of how to operate the radios, cleaning maintenance, deal with faults etc. Currumbin SLSC is on Channel 2 (Gold-South) which has already been set.

The most important cleaning message is that WET BATTERIES WILL DAMAGE THE CHARGER AND THE RADIO SO PLEASE ENSURE THE BATTERY IS COMPLETELY DRY BEFORE CHARGING.

Any radio faults or issues need to be reported immediately to Club Captain - Peter Harding (0412 261 041) as there is a managed replacement program for radios that are not functioning properly.

We ask that everyone takes good care of these new radios and encourage all our patrol members to become familiar with them.

AUSSIE POOL RESCUE CHAMPIONSHIPS

As the legendary Freddie Mercury sang, "We are the Champions, my friend" and our Vikings sure fought to the end to secure back-to-back Aussie Pool Rescue titles.

The Mighty Vikings put in another incredible performance in the pool to secure the Opens competition on 471 points, with Northcliffe second on 420 points and Metropolitan Caloundra third on 175 points.

Our Head Coach, Rachelle King, said after the final results, "It's super exciting to be able to do it again for a second year. We have worked really hard as a club the past few years to build up our program so its great to see all of our members contributing to that. We have so many members from so many age groups and we just focused on getting all of our skills right and enjoying the sport, and I feel that all came together this weekend".

The Pool Rescue Championships return to Adelaide for 2025 and 2026, a historically happy hunting ground for the Vikings. Let's go!





Congratulations also go to our **Queensland Cyclones representatives** who won the Interstate Competition, with NSW finishing second and South Australia coming third.

The Cyclones also took home the Alan Whelpton AP Shield awarded to the state with the highest cumulative points total across the entire surf sport season.

The three days of competition saw the Pool Rescue athletes make history with 33 Australian records broken, including four world records. Our Vikings record holders included our Currumbin Team A for the Male Open 4x25m Manikin Relay and individual records for Callum and Riley Brennan.

SWELL SCULPTURE FESTIVAL



The Lifesaving World Championships lived up to expectations and was well worth all the hype. Over 3 weeks in August and September, athletes from across the world descended on the beautiful Gold Coast to compete across all lifesaving disciplines and pit themselves against the best of the best.

It was a mammoth effort of coordination and organisation and a huge thanks goes to Sharon Brennan, Carole Walle, Kurtis Smith, our coaches, officials and sponsors and the wider athlete and parent support network for banding together to achieve some incredible results.

Up first was the Masters Pool Rescue with a World Champion title in the 200-230 Yrs 4x50m Obstacle Relay team of **Brett Dowker**, **Ben Cox**, **Jared Clarke** and **Paul O'Shea**. The lads repeated their winning ways the next day with the 200-230 Yrs 4x50m Manikin relay by a margin of 0.3 seconds. Finally, on the third day, the Fab Four clean swept the 200-230 Yrs relay events securing the gold in the 4x25m Manikin relay.

Congratulations also to **Len Cook** and **Rob Dunlop** who both medalled across the pool rescue events.

Our Masters carried on their success to Kurrawa beach for the ocean events with **Ben Cox** winning the Board Race and Ironman, as well as the Board Rescue with **Paul O'Shea**. **Greg Cox** and **Brett Dowker** won the 55-59 Yrs Board Rescue and then combined with Paul O'Shea to win the 150-170 Yrs Surf Team. Brett and Paul combined with Ben Cox to win the 150-170 Yrs Board Relay.

A combination of our Masters athletes also placed in the 170+ Yrs Board Relay, Ski Relay and Oceanman Relay, as well as in the 130-150 Yrs Ski Relay and Oceanman Relay. Well done to Chris Maynard, Michael Chase Smith, Rob Dorrough, Daniel Cowper, Shaun Robertson, Ben Cahill and Jason Searle who made up these teams and contributed to the medal haul.
